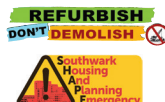

Tell the government: Housing action is needed now

We face the worst housing crisis in decades. Too many people are surviving on the bare minimum necessities of life – children’s standards are now comparable to over 100 years ago. It’s time to fix it.

Call out to tenants, housing activists, trade unions; unite all housing campaigns and build the lobby of the government’s spring financial statement.

- Action to tackle the housing crisis
- Rent controls now
- A mass programme of council housing, building and acquiring new homes. Funded by government and paid for by taxing the rich and corporations
- Leading organisations are reporting record numbers of street homeless, and threatened homelessness is rising in 2025.



- Over 250,000 people are homeless, stuck in temporary accommodation, such as hostels and bed and breakfasts
- We blame successive governments, not refugees and migrants, for this crisis
